SARAH BROWN Mixed Media Artist



I enjoy creating artwork with a narrative, each piece has its own story to tell. I mainly work in 3D, and in mixed media which includes textiles, foils, wire and beads. Some of my figures are created from papier mache, scrim, and plaster and painted with acrylics. I also design upcycled jewellery from found objects and packaging, stitching into the surfaces and layering with gold leaf and fabric. I like the idea of finding something worthless and transforming it into something beautiful.

SHELAGH BROWN Textiles



Textile artist, spinner, dyer, knitter and weaver exploring the changing colours, textures and moods of ancient Dartmoor, its landscapes and mystical atmosphere. Celebrating wool. sustainable natural fibres and slow artisan methods, I process raw fibres to make unique contemporary throws, cushions, scarves, sweaters and accessories. British and rarebreed lambswool sourced from local farms and traditional wool mills, often avoiding waste.



ANNE CROZIER Textiles





HANNAH WISDOM Textiles




