





TVAONB - Calstock Wetlands & Footbridge



A new footbridge, created as part of the River Tamar Walkway & Wetland Project in Calstock, is now open, enabling the local community and visitors to enjoy the wildlife that is flocking to the recently flooded wetland area.

The footbridge is the final piece of the jigsaw in this £3.1 million flood defence scheme in the village of Calstock in east Cornwall, delivered by a partnership between the Environment Agency, Tamar Community Trust, Calstock Parish Council, Calstock Footpath Society and Tamar Valley AONB. It has been designed and constructed to span the breach through the old flood embankment (now redundant as a flood defence) and to maintain the much-valued permissive footpath. This was a condition imposed by Cornwall Council on the Environment Agency's planning application for the wider flood defence and habitat creation scheme.

The community's new footbridge is an integral part of the works, maintaining the 1.2km stretch – described as a jewel in the crown – of the Tamar Valley Discovery Trail that extends some 35 miles from the north to the south of the Tamar Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Walkers can safely use the bridge now, and it will be officially opened on Tuesday 14th June at 4:30pm.

Jane Kiely, Chair of Tamar Community Trust, is delighted that the project is now complete; "Tamar Community Trust is delighted to see the bridge open, enabling people to once again enjoy this fabulous stretch of the river and the new wetland habitat. It's great to see the increasing abundance of wildlife beginning to use the wetlands, too, include sedge and reed warblers, Canada geese, shelducks, moorhens, heron, little egret and even an otter! Thanks to all our partners on this scheme for the hard work and determination in getting to this stage."

The visitors were greeted with tea and cakes and then taken on a leisurely stroll through the acre of gardens and on to the circuit around Downgate woods.



OPEN STUDIOS - We have reduced the fees

Open Studios applications were launched at the beginning of April and the deadline has been extended to May 14th because very few applications had been received by the original deadline of 29th April. The minimum number of participants needed to render Open Studios viable is 50, so this was a cause of concern. Feedback from members has made it clear that the cost of living crisis is having a knock on effect and that the standard fee (which has remained largely unchanged for several years) has become financially non-viable for most of you. The Committee has heeded your concerns and we believe we have a viable alternative to the current format.

The most significant cost associated with Open Studios (and consequently, the only area in which a big enough saving can be made) is the brochure. To allow Open Studios to take place in 2022 the following has been decided:

ENTRANCE FEES

- The entrance fee for a solo artist to be reduced to £40
- \bullet The entrance fee for sharing artists to be reduced to £35 (£5 less to reflect less signage required) MARKETING
- The brochure will be reduced to 1000 print run (cost approximately £1 per copy)
- Hard copy brochures will be available in venues ONLY.
- A5 Flyers and posters will be used to advertise widely in hard copy and digital format.
- Flyers and posters will include a QR code leading directly to a digital turn page copy of the brochure on the website.
- Social Media/website marketing strategy to be maximised as the most effective and cost free option.
- The emphasis will be to provide a digital option as the primary source, this reduces both cost and carbon footprint.

BROCHURE DESIGN

- A simplified design in a smaller format.
- The brochure will be the same size as the Drawn to Make brochure (square 13.5cm x 13.5cm)
- 'Venue Menu' will appear at the beginning of the brochure and will be a key to the artist entries that follow.
- The 'Venue Menu' will give each venue a number, detailing address, location, opening times and icons indicating facilities available.
- There will be NO maps, these require an expensive licence to use.
- Venue directions will be negated by the use of a What3Words reference, all applicants will be required to supply this information.
- Each artist to receive exactly the same space in the brochure, with entry linked to the venue number
- Artist entries will NOT include a biography to allow for a concise format.
- Artist entry to include:
- Image
- Name
- Discipline
- Phone
- Email
- Website and/or DttV website profile link
- Social media tags
- Commissions

Those participants who have already completed their application need do nothing for the moment, the information you have given is enough to start and we will get in touch to establish your What3Words reference.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ARTISTS

TRESORYS KERNOW - LAUNCESTON

A collaborative pilot project developed by Cornwall Museums Partnership (CMP) and Creative Kernow (CK) and funded through the Community Renewal Fund. The project aims to test out new ways of commissioning sustainable cultural activity in town centres.

This project envisages a small group of creative practitioners with different practices, such as fine art, ceramics, printmaking and poetry, having an ongoing presence in the centre of Launceston for a period of up to ten weeks. These creative practitioners would find their own ways of engaging both local communities and visitors with their creative practice. This could include workshops, talks, conversations, exhibitions but may take many other forms.

A range of activities and events will be taking place across Cornwall during the spring and summer of 2022 in the following locations: Saltash, Lostwithiel, St Austell, Penzance, Porthcurno, Newquay, Truro, Bude, Bodmin and Launceston. There will be multiple organisations and individuals involved in many ways.

Studios on the High Street is a programme of residencies for artists and other creative practitioners that will be happening in two empty shops and a pub/hotel in Launceston for up to ten weeks, starting in mid-May 2022. It is open to anyone with an established (at least two years) creative practice and can include individual creative practitioners or a groups of creative practitioners.

There are three different locations in Launceston town centre that will be available for use. One of these is the lounge inside the entrance of the White Hart Hotel. This can accommodate one person. The other two locations are empty shops. One of which can accommodate three people and one can accommodate two. We hope to confirm exactly which two shops will be available very soon, but wanted to get this brief out before Easter as the timescale is quite limited.

In your proposal, please let us know whether you'd prefer to work alone or prefer to share a space. If you have a collaboration in mind, please make that clear too.

We believe that cultural activity can play an important role in regenerating town centres, giving people a good reason to spend time there. We also believe that artists and creative practitioners of all types could play a key part in this. For many people, art and creative practice often takes place out of sight or in spaces not accessible by all. By placing creativity at the heart of a community we hope to inspire more people to both enjoy and engage with many artistic forms. For many artists there are a lack of studio spaces available and opportunities to engage with wider audiences. Studios on the High Street will enable artists and creative practitioners to try out new spaces and ideas whilst also reaching out to new audiences.

We are 'The Mighty Chondria'. As a team of 4 we have pledged to raise money while taking on Samworth Brothers triathlon style Charity Challenge!

After being postponed in 2021 due to Covid-19 we are pleased to announce the decision has been made to forge ahead with the biannual Charity Challenge on Saturday 18th June 2022. Many charities and other good causes have suffered greatly from a massive decline in charitable donations during Covid and the amazing level of fund raising that the Charity Challenge generates is needed more than ever.

The challenge has raised £2.2 million for good causes since it was launched in 2007. Our focus now is on making the 2022 event the greatest fundraiser yet. Our previous event record is £385,000 and we would like to ask for your support in smashing that total.

The challenge will be held in the Brecon Beacons. As with previous Challenges, the event is a triathlon style challenge, high levels of fitness and stamina are required. The route involves 9km on foot with a 322m elevation, 12 km canoe section followed by 37km on bike with a 990m elevation.
