














This autumn the Bull Pen Gallery and Drawn to the Valley are celebrating the contemporary art and artists of the Tamar Valley.

I am a mosaic artist but since going to PCA which has just become AUP (Arts University Plymouth). I have widened my skills, although I still make mosaics as well.

Here are three new paths I have explored as part of my course. The first one is 'Punk Never Dies'. I made this as a different unit for my 1st year and I decided to add the frame to give it a new meaning of art. The second photo is the piece as it was worn for my presentation.

The next photo is the 'Welcoming Hands' fruit basket. This was made for my other module and it took 80 hours to carve them from two sections of oak. These are actually copies of my own hands, the lower basket I made from welding steel together.

The third is 'New Meaning', something I made from a moulded tree slice with the use of resin. I then designed and made the frame from steel in AUP.


IN MEMORIAM - GABRIELLE GOODCHILD



IN MEMORIAM - ADELA POWELL

A magnificent artist, Adela Powell's work remains as a powerful legacy for the Tamar Valley where she lived and worked in the last decade.

A lifetime in the study of ceramics was poured into her remarkable pieces. Shell forms with abrasive exteriors married to the smoothest caressable interior surfaces, enigmatic torsos whose multi-layered glazes seem to flow down gracefully into unexpected pockets of colour and fragmented forms seemingly battered by nature in all its fury.

A deep thinker about her practice, she would sometimes disappear for days into the studio, emerging exhausted with collections of remarkable scale and power.

Natural forms dominate, eminently tactile with sometimes the effect of decay and weathering. She often liked to ground the work within its surroundings by, for example, adding Tamar river mud to the mix.

She was widely known and celebrated by the ceramics community both locally and nationally, and her pieces will always inspire admiration and wonder.

We have lost a true original, who will undoubtedly inspire artists for generations to come and whose work was immensely popular with us and visitors to Limekiln Gallery.

TAVISTOCK YOUNG ARTISTS PROJECT

Drawn to the Valley member Andy Cairns is looking to boost the creativity of children and young adults in Tavistock through a year of art activities and events.

The Tavistock Young Artists Project will be themed around Sustainable Futures, building on the highly successful Flags of Hope project and parade. This involved over 1000 primary school children creating flags and parading around town to draw attention to the need for action to avert climate catastrophe.

Andy, project leader from West Devon Art Workshops, explained: "The project will be an opportunity both to celebrate the creativity of young people and amplify their voice in calling for a sustainable future for us and our planet."

Sessions will explore using recycled, natural and sustainable materials to create exciting artworks.

The aim is to:

- Set up two Art Clubs one for 5-10 year olds and one for 11-19 year olds;
- Run at least one day of workshops for 10 local schools:
- Encourage schools and community involvement in Tavistock Carnival through staff training sessions and community workshops;

Andy added "Last time the project was run in 2016, on a shoestring, it involved over 200 children and young adults. This time we want the project to be bigger and better! To achieve this, we have set up a crowdfunding project with BA Better World Community Fund to raise £12,860 – if we reach half that target (£6,430) British Airways will provide the rest."

Drawn to the Valley is presenting 'Face Value'. The theme of the exhibition is to depict the many faces of our Valley- both natural and human. Is there someone you feel should be honoured or a landscape that is meaningful to you?

VENUE: Tamar Valley Centre, Cemetery Road, Gunnislake, Cornwall PL18 9FE

IMPORTANT DATES FOR APPLICANTS:

- Entry closing date: Wednesday 19th October
- Delivery of Work: Thursday 17th November 4:30pm 6pm (to be followed by the AGM at 6:30pm)
- Private view: Friday 18th November 6:30pm 9pm including Colin Pethick Demo
- Take Down: Sunday 27th November
- Collection of work: Sunday 27th November from 11am 1pm

TAKING PART:

- £20 fee per person.
- 20% commission (all exhibiting artist are guaranteed a space in the workshops free of charge).
- There is room for up to 50 exhibitors on a first apply basis,
- This will be an "off the wall " exhibition therefore, if images are sold we will contact you to deliver further pieces.
- All participating artists ware obliged to steward at least one day during the exhibition.
- Artist to provide a statement piece about their artwork on A6 card, this will be used for a creative montage within the exhibition space. Please relate this to one of your pieces of work. Give the story of what this person/place means to you. Our fans/ customers are always hungry for these details. You can make your A6 card individual too by hand writing it, ancient typewriter print etc doodles.
- Please include on your card name of Image, name of artist, media used and price.

ARTISTS WORK - SPECIFICATIONS:

- Maximum of four works per person. With two guaranteed to be hung and two held in reserve.
- To offer the opportunity to explore and learn the art of portraiture- we have suggested that works not be framed for the exhibition- to cut down on costs to artists and our potential purchasers.
- Presented on board (finished to gallery standard), or backed and mounted to be hung unframed)
- If work is on board- eg ply -it can be hung with plate hangers.
- Canvas on a frame-hung with string attached with d rings.
- If mounted- They must be backed but not wrapped and will be hung with layers of foam under bull dog clips (washing line style).
- "Off the Peg" category- allows the artist to be freer still. Pieces can simply be done on paper but must be original work. They will be pegged up on string and sold for £10 each.
- We understand that some artists may still wish to frame their work -particularly for a medium such as pastels. This will be accepted if framed to usual standards- d rings and string.
- Original artwork, maximum size of one metre in any direction, unless discussed with working party.
- 3D Work Artists are welcome to create 3D work, obviously dependent on size.
- Jewellery 9x pieces,
- Ceramics/Porcelain 3-4 x pieces
- Plinths/display provided by artists.
- Browser 5 x pieces per person, mounted and neatly wrapped in cellophane to a professional standard please and labelled.
- A5 size images £10 per image. (Unmounted but original artwork) 4 x pieces per person
- Cards 30 cards per person, any subject. Max size: A5, Max price £3.00. Cards must be in a clear sleeves with artist name on and priced. Maximum price £3 in increments of 50p please
- Remember to ask permission to display from the subject of your portrait.

NOMINATIONS FOR THE NEW COMMITTEE:

To be able to run this group with all its activities efficiently we would need some more members to step up to serve on the committee.

The committee typically meets every third Thursday of the month at the Tamar Valley Centre, or on occasion at Ocean Studios in Royal William Yard. The meetings usually last approximately three hours.

The committee is made up of not less than 5 and not more than 15 members. Each member serves a maximum of three years. We have three committee members who have reached the end of their three year term. We also have one resignation from committee members. This leaves us with five remaining committee members. This is only just quorate and we anticipate that holding successful meetings every month will be a challenge with so few on the committee. We therefore encourage anyone who would be able to commit to a committee role to step forward now.

Any member can serve on the committee, including previous committee members who have had a year off the committee. It is very rewarding work and a real opportunity to influence how Drawn to the Valley is run for the benefit of all its members.

In particular, we are seeking to fill the following roles as essential to the running of the committee under the terms set out in the constitution:
