

FEATURED ARTIST - Stu Anderson

I grew up in Tavistock before spending 20 years living in Newcastle Upon Tyne and then came back to the South West 10 years ago, now living in St Germans in Cornwall.

Tavistock still remains one of my favourite places, but being in Newcastle for early adulthood was brilliant and it is one of the greatest cities in the world-that's why I stayed there for so long!

After school, I trained at South Devon College in Torquay under the abstract Cornish artist John Chambers and wanted to get into sculpture as I was heavily influenced by Giacometti and Gormley. However, a change of direction mainly due to a potential rugby playing career took me up to the North East where I studied at both Newcastle and Northumbria Universities... but not in the arts.



As a career in business progressed, I always continued to draw and sketch as I travelled, mainly in pen and wash. I've worked in many sectors including music and the arts, and oil and gas so travelled a lot. As I travelled I did quick watercolour and pen sketches on blank postcards and sent them to friends rather than the usual postcards!

As time went on, I got back into painting seascapes and landscapes in oils and more recently portraits in pastels. There is so much to paint in the South West and I love going up on Dartmoor, or painting from my boat pottering on the Tamar.

I am also fascinated by 'pub life'- a myriad of life and expressions to sketch are in pubs and I'm lucky to still have two good ones in and around the village. At the moment, I'm really enjoying using charcoal and pastels and have recently completed a project at my local pub carrying out portraits of many of the locals which are now up on the wall- great fun.

My favourite artists tend to come from the impressionist movement- Cezanne particularly. I would love to have lived in France when they were around at the end of the 19th Century and have been able to sit and have a chat over an absinthe or two, Paris at the turn of the century must have been an amazing place to be.


Who do you most admire?


MARK FIELDING


JANE ATHRON

Please email Ren on contact@drawntothevalley.org or your Area Rep to book your space at your preferred session (which need not be the one in your area).

Before you book, please make sure that you can bring with you digital copies of the images you want to use as a profile picture and images of any items you wish to sell through the gallery section of your profile. You can bring these on your phone, Ipad or on a memory stick.

There are some common misunderstandings of how the process works, which it may be helpful to clear up at this stage, so here is some clarification:

- You will need a login to access the forms for setting up your profile, or updating your gallery, which are to be found in your users menu.
- If you do not know your login, get in touch with Ren and she can send you a link to create a new password.
- The process is not automatic and you cannot set up your profile or upload information or items to your gallery directly; all the methods of delivering the information for your profile and gallery are sent to Ren, who uses the information you provide to create your profile for you.

If you are unable to attend any of the above sessions, or if you find everything just too technically difficult, Ren can do it all for you via email instead, so if this all sounds too daunting, please get in touch with her on: contact@drawntothevalley.org

If you already have a profile, please remember that you need to let Ren know of any updates or sold items ASAP. You can have as many items in your gallery as you want, there is no longer a limit of three items only. Finally, don't forget to share the link to your gallery on your social media and whenever you are promoting yourself.

PLEASE NOTE: To avoid any confusion or disappointment, we will not be able to show you how to create your own website, for this you will need to either google 'free website builder', pick one and have a go (they are all very user friendly), or you could employ a professional to do it for you (can be expensive), or bribe a teenager!

CAN YOU HELP?

HEADDRESSES FOR THE MAD HATTERS' TEA-TIME EVENT ON APRIL 30TH 2023.

We've had a request for help from Helena Ancil, who is a children's writer and on the Tavistock Festival Committee. She's organising a 'Mad Hatters Tea Party' in April for Children and is seeking help in having two headpieces made for the characters who will welcome people to the event. She explains about it below

My name is Helena Ancil and I am part of the Tavistock Festival of Music and the Arts, Steering Group. During the coming year's festival, there is to be a Tea-time event with entertainment, in the form of verse readings etc. from Alice's Adventures in Wonderland and Through the Looking Glass, by Lewis Carroll.

To welcome the audience to the event, which is being held in the Gallery, at The Bedford Hotel on April 30th. I am hoping to have actors playing the March Hare, the Dormouse and the Hatter. The Hatter is not causing me a problem, as we have a Top Hat for the actor to wear but I wondered if there was an artist amongst Drawn To The Valley, who might be able to create wearable heads, from papier-mâché maybe (?) for the March Hare - played by an adult and the Dormouse played by a smaller person, yet to be decided upon. Below are attached Tenniel's illustrations, which hopefully give an idea of what I am looking for... I would like the headdresses to resemble them as much as possible, please... I love the straw about the hare's ears and his eyes! The Dormouse should appear to be "dropping off to sleep", of course...

The characters will be active in the vestibule: taking tickets from the Party Goers and giving them directions to the 'tea-party' entrance. Therefore, the wearers shall need to be able to see where they are going easily and to be heard easily, if they speak. I would like the character's eyes and mouths to be shown on fabric that disguises the actor's eyes and mouth, but does not impede vision or necessary talking.

If you have ever been involved with making theatrical or carnival costumes, I am sure that these headdresses would cause you no problem at all. I am afraid that I am not skilled in this field of the creative arts, which is why I am craving your skilful assistance!

If you are interested in being involved with this Festival event, please email your designs with details of how the headdresses are to be secured and your contact details, to your Chairman Anne Payne, who will contact me. Also, please include an estimate for all costs. The artist's name will appear in the event's programme, as will their membership of Drawn To The Valley, if appropriate to them, of course. Thank you very much for reading this and I do most sincerely hope that being involved in this project appeals!

A new piece of public art funded by Historic England through the High Street Heritage Access Zone programme is being commissioned by Plymouth's Public Art Steering Group, with a call out to artists to apply now.

The commission will respond to the themes of British Art Show 9, which runs in Plymouth until 8 January 2023. For the purpose of this commission, public art is defined in its widest sense and commissions are sought from artists who have a strong socially engaged practice, as showcased in BAS9. OPEN TO ARTISTS LIVING IN DEVON-

<u>Finch Foundry</u> a National Trust Museum, have accepted a proposal to host an exhibition in the grounds of their garden. Please see below for details of the agreed terms and how to apply to take part. This is an exciting opportunity to host an innovative art show in a very unique setting.

- The theme is 'ecology' and forms a response to the climate crisis, focussing on the question 'what does it mean to be part of the material world and not separate from it'?
- All media are accepted as long as they respond to the environmental concerns and messages of the exhibition.
- All artwork must be family friendly and not political in a way that can be seen as offensive as the show intends to empower and unite.
- The grounds are open to the public at night, set within a quiet rural location the risk of damage to work is minimal but artists must agree and understand that their work will not be securely locked at night time.
- All artists must acquire public liability insurance.
- There is no available funding currently but I will be putting in proposals in the new year with the support of the staff at the foundry.
- There are roles available to artists that wish to be more involved such as being on the curatorial team, marketing, fundraising, poster design etc.
- All artists will need to complete a risk assessment of their work nearer the time to installing.
- All artists will need to be responsible for the installation and take down of their own work but it is hoped we will all work as a team with this.
- The Finch staff have offered each partaking artist a day to visit the foundry free of charge where they will be given a tour of its history. Artists can apply via email with a short summary of their interests, images of their work and proposed work for the show and how it responds to the aims listed above. It is understood however that potential work can change so it is not a binding statement.
