Spring Exhibition Report

Still Drawing, Twenty Years On A celebration of 20 years of Drawn to the Valley & Spring Exhibition 2024

At the start of the millennium the Tamar Valley was designated an 'Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty' and the AONB centre at Drakewalls was established. Artists in the Tamar Valley drew together to collaborate with AONB and in 2004 the Drawn to the Valley network of artists was born.

Twenty years on, we have over 120 artists from Plymouth to Bude exhibiting in our annual programme of events and a well-established website to showcase our work.

This year our Spring Exhibition was held over the bank holiday weekend in The Market Hall, Devonport from Friday 24th to Monday 27th May, a fabulous Victorian building that has been refurbished as a community centre, café and business hub.

Our Private View on the Saturday evening was also our 20th Anniversary celebration of Drawn to the Valley, to which all members were invited. Ali Fife Cook, our current Chair, gave a brief welcome and Mary Toon, Jillian Morris and Alan Dax, three artists exhibiting at the Spring Exhibition, kindly recalled their memories of earlier days when the network was in its infancy. The Market Hall houses an amazing 15m diameter domed screen and on this we screened a beautiful video of most of the artwork on display at the exhibition during the event, to a backdrop of birdsong, bringing our images to life, where soaring eagles, majestic tors, sea views and still life could be seen in superb detail.

As a new venue, we were delighted with the response of guests to this event. The incredible light airy backdrop and quality of art on display made for a highly professional exhibition. We would like to thank all the artists who took part for their support and Real Ideas who own the venue for their flexibility and vision in enabling us to showcase our artwork in their beautiful venue.

Featured Artist - Neil Mawdsley

Neil Mawdsley is an artist who is inspired by the beautiful landscape of the Tamar Valley. His love of this area, particularly around Saltash, goes back many years. In fact he wrote a poetic piece of prose about this inspiring landscape many years ago; it is entitled Diary of a Painter: A Trip to Saltash Passage (October 1989). This short extract provides a flavour of the piece:



The base late softings in autumn. here was a sharpness and stillness. Sumshine too. It was alf terms and ready moning. I was free to explore towards in hour or two. I looked over towards framar walley. However, the state of the state of the looked over towards was mint. A valley mist that comes down the river for only a few days of the year. That was it ... off to the river ... to see more ...






"I approached the river from St. Budeaux. The sunshine was perfect until I was almost at Saltash Passage. Then I felt the dampness and gradual filtering of the sunlight. As I arrived at the old ferry point, there was such a stillness as I moved towards the river. The water was like a pale browny-tinged glass leading away to infinity. There was no skyline only a veil of mist clothing sea and sky."







Neil in his own words: "I paint in all mediums and dabble in the odd sculpture. Plymouth is my home town and many of my paintings involve the sea and the Devon and Cornwall coasts.

For many years I taught children with learning difficulties and later I ran watercolour classes for adults. My shipwreck posters of Plymouth Sound has sold internationally and somewhere it is listed in the city archives. There is much more about me that is more interesting on my website."




